THANK YOU!!

We continue to receive donations weekly to help pay back the "Roof" Loan. We can't pay back the loan without all of YOU!!. We appreciate your generosity and support. Every dollar helps and we Thank You for every one you contribute!!

As of this month we have taken in a total of \$37,975 in donations which does not include any of the fundraisers that the "Fun" Raising Teams has done this year. The fundraisers are included in the budget to help off set the \$17,685 Capital Improvement Loan line item that was put in the budget for 2024.

In March of 2023 the Church Body gave the church permission to take out a 7-year interest free loan from our own Capital Improvement Investment Account in the amount of \$130,820 to pay for a new roof. With your generous donations of \$37,975 and the \$17,685 line item in the budget we currently have \$55,660. towards our loan pay back leaving a balance of **\$75,160** left on the loan. The loan is scheduled to be paid back by April 2030 and our hope is to be able to pay it off early. If your generous donations continue to come in we will most likely meet our goal and be able to pay it off early!! Thank you!!

If there is no name on the envelope the donation cannot be recorded and will be considered an "Anonymous" donation.

Christmas Basket and "Gift Giving" Information....

Hoping that by the time you read this, we will already have family information and been able to get started on our shopping for gifts for our families. [The Christmas Basket program only guarantees a Christmas dinner for families.]

Food pickup from the Food Shelf, perishable food purchase, and delivery of the Christmas "Baskets" and gifts will occur on Friday, December 20th.

Challenges:

- **Timing:** A lot happening on Friday, December 20th.
- COVID/Flu: COVID and the flu continue to challenge us.
- There is a greater need for Christmas Basket Sponsors: We have increased the number of families we will be assisting and, to do so, we are looking at the following:
 - The cost of food: Yes, it has gone up. We are reducing the amount/variety that
 we have provided in the past with the knowledge that the recipients will still
 receive other items from the Food Shelf.
 - o **Gifts:** Hoping that all of our tags have been taken to purchase family gifts!

Those who would like to provide a gift (and can do so by December 16)

- Contact Jayne Gerega at <u>jgerega@rochester.rr.com</u> or 392-9737 if you haven't selected a family/person. She will try to match you up with someone – and will provide as much information as possible. (Note: Mindi Barnes will be assisting so you may hear from her.)
- Please remember Try to limit your gifts to \$10-\$20 per person. It may be sad/difficult for one family member to get several packages to open, while another only gets one and families in the program do compare their Christmas baskets with others who receive baskets from other organizations. Gift cards are an excellent choice for an individual or perhaps something larger if you choose to do the whole family. (Note: Tops gift cards can be purchased through the church for adults. Walmart gift cards might also be good for a family since they deliver and they can purchase food and other items in case you want to allow the family to do their own shopping. If you want to donate money for gifts and have us do the shopping for you, we can do that...)

Return gifts by Monday, December 16th. Please wrap your gift and place the tag on the gift for identification. (It will be a "Family Number" and age/gender combination. Use the tag that you selected when signing up.) Make sure that you note the return on the sign-up sheet.

Our church is blessed with a congregation of givers - who provide generously through the Communion Offering so that we can, and do, exceed the requested list of items for the Christmas Baskets. We attempt to provide enough food for several meals - not just enough for one day.

As a new activity, we will be trying to involve the kids with the assembly of the non-perishables on December 15th. We will likely need to set aside another morning (December 19th) to make sure that the "baskets" have the appropriate non-perishables and gifts, On December 20th, we will finally add the perishable foods that we purchased along with the foods supplied by the Food Shelf and other local organizations – as we prepare them for pick up or delivery.

We thank you in advance for your participation in the Christmas Basket Program and for your generous giving to the Communion Offering throughout the year!
