### **Hilton Baptist Church**

Dear Friends and Family of Hilton Baptist Church,

Most of you know that I am a diabetic. Attached to my body is an insulin pump which helps to regulate my sugar levels. Also attached is a sensor which communicates to my pump telling it if I require more or less insulin to keep my glucose level in a healthy range

Recently I acquired a new and updated pump. It was long overdue. My previous pump was significantly cracked and outdated. The sensor stopped working several months ago and I was monitoring my sugar levels myself. Admittedly, sometimes I was lazy in doing so and as a result my sugar levels were not always in the healthiest range.

Although my doctor has been telling me for quite some time I needed to update my pump, I kept avoiding and putting off the decision. I had various reasons for doing so:

It was going to be too much of a hassle to get a new pump. Getting trained on a new pump would take up time that I'd rather be using elsewhere. How much was a new pump going to cost me? My pump may have some cracks, but it still works. I'll take care of it when I *really* need to.

I am comfortable and familiar with my old pump. Why make my life more complicated? How is this really going to improve my life when everything seems fine now? Getting a new pump, may require me to start taking my diabetes more seriously.

So, let me ask you to seriously consider this question:

If you had known I was relying on a worn out, broken down, outdated insulin pump to manage my health... and.... I was using the above reasons/excuses/ explanations to avoid getting a new one – what would you have said to me?

<u>Seriously</u>.....what would you have said? I suspect some of you would have taken a direct and firm approach: "Dan, this is your health. Stop making excuses and take care of this NOW!" While others of you might take a gentler, yet more imploring approach: "Dan, we don't want anything bad to happen to you. PLEASE get a new pump."

Okay, now it is my turn. How is it with your soul? Is it cracked and broken down but you keep telling yourself "Yeah, but it still works"? Is it easier to stay with the "old model" because it's just more familiar and comfortable and trying to "update" it will require too much time and energy? Are you concerned about how much it will cost you? Are you telling yourself "I'll take care of this when I *really* need to?"

Is taking care of my own physical health any less important than you taking care of your own soul? If <u>YOU</u> would want me to care for my own body, is it unreasonable for <u>ME</u> to want you to care for your own soul in a similar way? If you find my own explanations to be unacceptable and inexcusable, what would you say about your own?

The holidays will soon be upon us. This is a season of gratitude, light, love, family and faith. If your could is in need of an undeter new is a good time to be in

faith. If your soul is in need of an update, now is a good time to be in church and to stop with the excuses. The doors are open and we'll be here. God will be here too. The choice, and the consequences of that choice, is in your hands.

**Family information will become available to us Late-November.** This is when we typically call the families to get information regarding needs, wants, sizes, ages, pets, etc., then create "tags" for our "Tag Tree/Table" and sign up lists, and put together the table where you could choose those tags. *[The Christmas Basket program only guarantees a Christmas dinner for families.]* 

Food pickup from the Food Shelf, perishable food purchase, and delivery of the Christmas "Baskets" and gifts will occur on Friday, December 20<sup>th</sup>.

#### Challenges:

- **Timing:** A lot happening on Friday, December 20<sup>th</sup>.
- **<u>COVID/Flu:</u>** COVID and the flu continue to challenge us.



- <u>There is a greater need for Christmas Basket Sponsors</u>: We have increased the number of families we will be assisting and, to do so, we are looking at the following:
  - o <u>The cost of food</u>: Yes, it has gone up. We are reducing the amount/variety that we normally provide with the knowledge that the recipients will still receive other items from the Food Shelf.
  - o <u>**Gifts:**</u> More people are watching on-line and will not be enticed by our "Tag-Tree-Table" to purchase gifts so if you can help, let us know!

#### Those who would like to provide a gift (and can do so by December 16)

- We hope to have gift tags on the table by November 24<sup>th</sup> but if you pre-purchase a generic gift, we can as sign it to a person/family who may not otherwise be selected.
- Or you can contact Jayne Gerega at <u>jgerega@rochester.rr.com</u> or 392-9737. She will try to match you up with someone and will provide as much information as possible. (Note: Mindi Barnes will be assisting so you may hear from her.)
- Please remember Try to limit your gifts to \$10-\$20 per person. It may be sad/difficult for one family member to get several packages to open, while another only gets one and families in the program do compare their Christmas baskets with others who receive baskets from other organizations. Gift cards are an excellent choice for an individual or perhaps something larger if you choose to do the whole family. (Note: Tops gift cards can be purchased through the church for adults. Walmart gift cards might also be good for a family since they deliver and they can purchase food and other items in case you want to allow the family to do their own shopping. If you want to donate money for gifts and have us do the shopping for you, we can do that...)

#### Return gifts by Monday, December 16<sup>th</sup>. Please wrap your gift and place the tag on the gift for identification.

(It will be a "Family Number" and age/gender combination. Use the tag that you selected when signing up.) Make sure that you note the return on the sign-up sheet.

Our church is blessed with a congregation of givers - who provide generously through the Communion Offering so that we can, and do, exceed the requested list of items for the Christmas Baskets. We attempt to provide enough food for several meals - not just enough for one day.

**As a new activity**, we will be trying to involve the kids with the assembly of the non-perishables on December 15<sup>th</sup>. We will likely need to set aside another morning (December 19<sup>th</sup>) to make sure that the "baskets" have the appropriate non-perishables and gifts, On December 20<sup>th</sup>, we will finally add the perishable foods that we purchased along with the foods supplied by the Food Shelf and other local organizations – as we prepare them for pick up or delivery.

We thank you in advance for your participation in the Christmas Basket Program and for your generous giving to the Communion Offering throughout the year!


