Dear Friends and Family of Hilton Baptist Church,



About a year after I began my pastoral ministry at HBC I had lunch with Rheanolte LeBarbour, a former pastor of this church. He asked me how I was doing and what were the challenges I was facing. I admitted to Rheanolte that I found it strenuous to write a new (and hopefully inspiring) sermon on a new and different topic every week (and) that Sundays sure do come around awfully quick!

Rheanolte's grin seemed to say "Yep, I've been there. I've done that." He then asked if I ever considered preaching different sermon series. He shared that in his own ministry he found that speaking on one subject over several weeks allowed his mind and spirit to focus on one area. He also said it seemed to help the congregation to stay engaged and interested as well.

I will admit that at the time I was somewhat resistant to sermon series. I questioned if they would inhibit God in some way because He was forced to follow <u>my</u> preaching calendar. I also wondered if I could be as spontaneous and follow wherever the Spirit might be leading me that particular week.

Looking back now, I feel ashamed and embarrassed by these thoughts. What arrogance! What an ego! What foolishness! As if somehow measly little me could hinder the plans of Almighty God. "It's not about you Dan!" See, even I am still learning that hard lesson that I so often share with you.

I considered Rheanolte's advice and gave his suggestion a try. I had also remembered that another pastor once shared that the series he had prayed over, prepared, and preached were extremely relevant at the time he shared them, as if God had been planning that all along. He also said he found when he planned ahead his mind and spirit would "find" ideas and illustrations that would fit a sermon in that particular series.

In time, I discovered I actually enjoyed preaching sermon series and that all my reservations were wrong. I also discovered that by taking the time to pray, seek God's direction and questioning what topics may need to be addressed in our church and in our world, God still seemed to speak a message into people's lives that needed to be heard at just that moment.

One of my favorite series was "Changes and Challenges." I had sensed this was the topic God wanted me to address as it was just about the time, we were renovating our sanctuary. I had no idea that the Covid pandemic was just around the corner and that those sermons may have been needed more than I realized. God knows what He is doing but obviously I am a slow learner.

Where do I get my ideas for a series? Most of the time I get a "hunch" or a "nudge" in my own soul regarding topics long before you hear about them. For example, our series this past December ("The Journey to the Manger") was on my mind and heart since December 2023! Believe it or not, I'm already sensing some ideas for Christmas 2025.

I wanted to share with you what you can expect on Sunday mornings in early 2025. Taking some time to reflect, pray and study I'm sensing these topics are those that I am being asked to share with you.

In January we will look at a prayer many of you are probably familiar with: The Serenity Prayer. I simply sense we may need to start the year with this. Throughout Lent our theme will be "Are You Listening?" We will be considering who or what we listen to that positively or negatively influences our walk with Christ.

I ask for your prayers as well as your prayers for those who may need to hear what God wishes to say through these series. And we certainly hope to see you in church, it's a good place to hear what the Lord may be saying to you.



In March of 2023 the Church Body gave the church permission to take out a 7-year interest free loan from our own Capital Improvement Investment Account in the amount of \$130,820 to pay for a new roof.

After 2-years of fundraising and receiving small to very large donations we have collected a total of \$69,011. to pay back the loan. Thanks to everyone's efforts and generous donations we have reached the half-way mark and only have **\$61,809** left to go.

We do have money in Memorial that will be dedicated this year during Memorial Sunday. After the money is dedicated we will include it in our total (FYI \sim Right now it covers 12 shingles).

The loan is scheduled to be paid back by April 2030 and our hope is to be able to pay it off early. If your generous donations continue to come in we will most likely meet our goal and be able to pay it off early!!

Families ranged in size from 1 person to 8 people; and, ages were from infants to adults well into their 80s. (*Note: Interestingly - this was two more households than last year but 18 fewer people*)

With your help, we supplied these families with items for their Christmas dinner and a few other meals – along with many, many gifts. The cost for this program – through the church – was about \$1,895. How to Give More and Save on Taxes at the Same Time

Did you know that if you are taking Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), it is possible to set up a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), so that you do not have to pay income tax on the entire RMD withdrawal?

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can donate to a charity via a withdrawal from your IRA without having to pay taxes on the withdrawal if you set up a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). Funds withdrawn from an IRA are typically considered taxable income.

If you are 73 or older, and therefore taking RMDs from your IRA, you can set up a QCD and it counts toward your RMD for that year. This is especially helpful, because the RMD is both mandatory and taxable. The QCD helps you alleviate the tax burden on the RMD you are required to take anyway.

One caveat: this opportunity is only available for IRAs. It does not apply to 401K, 403B, 457B, or other employer-based pretax retirement savings accounts.

Everyone's situation is different, so as always, it is best to consult your financial advisor for specific advice.

If you would like to learn more, and/or pursue setting up a QCD for a charitable organization that is near and dear to your heart, your IRA Administrator can provide guidance, forms, and instructions.
