Every June it has been my habit to offer some suggestions of books you may enjoy reading on a summer's day. Here are a few of the books that I read in the past year and found meaningful. Perhaps you will as well. These are not in any order of importance or significance.

Happy Reading! Dan

An Altar in the World - Barbara Brown Taylor

On the cover of my copy there is a review of this book that says *"Not a page-turner, it is a page lingerer. I wore out a highlighter marking passages I want to read again."* I agree with this person's assessment. This book is about noticing the sacred in everyday common experiences. Frequently something the author wrote would catch my attention and I would think "I've got to write that down and think about it some more." This book was a like a good vacation; I was glad to be there and sorry when it was over.

Joey – Jennifer Marshall Bleakley

This is a heartwarming and, at times, heartbreaking story about a horse named Joey. Due to neglect Joey is blind and finds a home with a rescue group that provides a place for children with traumatic experiences to interact with horses. This is the story of how a blind horse helps others to see hope, healing and faith.

Piercing Heaven – Prayers of the Puritans - Robert Elmer, Editor

This book of prayers took me about nine months to finish because I found it most beneficial when read slowly and attentively. At times, I have found the prayers of others to be helpful in "priming the pump" for my own prayers or to express the words I have trouble finding for myself. This book gave me both, and learning the history of the various contributors gave these prayers a greater sense of authenticity and authority as well.

Rembrandt is in the Wind – Russ Ramsey

Art can be a bit of a trojan horse. You may see a painting and think nothing of it until you realize something about it has caught your attention. Before you know it, you are drawn in and find yourself being inspired or informed by what is before you. This author takes some famous and not-so-famous paintings and tells us the stories and the deeper lessons behind them.

Renovation of the Heart in Daily Practice - Dallas Willard and Jan Johnson

The description for this book states "Experiments in Spiritual Transformation." Each chapter addresses a spiritual practice and then offers an "experiment" for the reader to attempt. This book is fairly straight forward and practical, but I did not find it to be dry and boring. I took my time reading it because it takes some focus to read it and I wanted the lessons to sink in. It's a good book if you are a "head" person and may need a spiritual kick-start.

The Wood Between the Worlds - Brian Zahnd

This is a book that addresses the centrality of the cross in our faith. It can feel a bit "scholarly" at times, but not too overbearing. I found this book challenging me intellectually and spiritually, forcing me to consider how seriously I take the cross in my own life. The author caused me to see the cross in ways I had not before and it was both thought-provoking and soul-prodding at the same time.

Did You Know?



Harry S. Truman, 33rd U.S. President

The One Great Hour of Sharing offering began seventy-seven years ago in response to the devastation of World War II. On Saturday evening, March 26, 1949, a national broadcast titled "One Great Hour" featured a remarkable assembly of national leaders and celebrities. The 33rd U.S. President, Harry S. Truman's, radio address during the broadcast included the following:

"There are thousands of children in foreign lands today who have no memory of their parents, no knowledge of the meaning of the words "home" and "family," and who have forgotten what it feels like to have enough to eat. There are hopeless thousands who wander among the shattered towns seeking a place to rest, seeking security and a chance to begin their lives anew. There are many who pray to God only in secret, fearing persecution if they profess their beliefs openly.

It is hard for us to comprehend grief and distress such as this because we in America are so much more fortunate. Our country has been blessed with material riches. Our homes are secure. We can go to our churches and worship God as we desire.

We know that we enjoy these great blessings not because of any special merit on our part, but because of the bounty of God. It is to His Providence that we owe the richness of our country and our heritage of freedom. Since these good things come to us from Him, we know that we must use them for the good of others in accordance with His will."

The broadcast concluded by asking Americans to give generously the next morning in their churches. More than 75,000 churches responded.

Today, One Great Hour of Sharing serves people in over 80 countries around the world. Sponsored by five Christian U.S. denominations and Church World Service, One Great Hour of Sharing makes sure that we can respond to needs as soon as they happen and that tens of thousands of people receive support for ongoing relief, rehabilitation, and development.

The World Relief Committee of the American Baptist Board of General Ministries reviews each development project request funded by the One Great Hour of Sharing offering received from American Baptists. Gifts reach the ministries and people in need through a network of regional and international partnerships with the following:

Baptist World Aid - the compassionate arm of the Baptist World Alliance, supporting three areas of ministry: relief, development, and support of national partners.
